REPORTS

Rick Baldwin said copies of the comment cards received at the January 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> Public Input meetings were included in their packets.

REVIEW OF PUBLIC INPUT

A motion was made to reconsider the recommendation for E4/E5.

Kitty Kinkade, Marie Lemos-Doran, and Barbara Moody were not present to vote.

Albert Delgado explained, after review, they found there are only eight students in an area who currently attend Gray Elementary School and there was no need to include them in the move to Derfelt Elementary School.

A motion was made to take the E4/E5 recommendation, as amended to leave the area south of Sahara Avenue, east of Cimarron Road, north of Edna Avenue, and west of Buffalo Drive at Gray Elementary School, forward to the Board of School Trustees for R.M. Bryan, Christensen, Decker, Derfelt, Diskin, Gray, Hayes, Jacobson, Kim, Ober, Piggott, and Rogers Elementary Schools.

A motion was made to reconsider the recommendation for E1/E7.

Gaya Guymon reviewed the proposals and said they need to reconsider the recommendation in order not to impact Deskin Elementary School so drastically and allow gradual growth in Kahre and Eisenberg Elementary Schools.

A motion was made to take the E1/E7 recommendation as amended to leave the area north of Hickam Avenue and the Mayfield Estates at Deskin Elementary School; and take the area bounded by Hickam Avenue, Tenaya Way, Alexander Road, and US-95 to Kahre and Eisenberg Elementary Schools to the Board of School Trustees for the new Bozarth Elementary School and Allen, Conners, Darnell, Deskin, Eisenberg, Kahre, Reed, Tarr, Tobler, and Thompson Elementary Schools.

Kitty Kinkade, Marie Lemos-Doran, and Barbara Moody were not present to vote.

Rick Baldwin informed the commission that an apartment building with 739 units is being built within the Thompson Elementary School boundaries. Mr. Baldwin said leasing will begin in March with 150 units and they will continue to release 150 units in two month phases until December when they reach total build out.

Gaya Guymon said there is still growth within the Bozarth Elementary School boundaries and they need to review the area next year to see how many students the apartment complex is yielding before they zone to Bozarth Elementary School as she did not want to have an area of students move back and forth.

Review of focus area E6 for Clyde Cox, Craig, Lowman, Manch, and Woolley Elementary Schools.

Gaya Guymon said because there was no public input, she spoke with Andrea Klafter-Phillips, Northeast Region Assistant Superintendent, who is familiar with the needs in the area, and she requested that Lowman and Manch Elementary Schools be kept at a lower enrollment and that she is in favor of proposal 1.

A motion was made to take focus area E6, proposal 1 as amended to take the boundary line south of Craig Road, west of Walnut Road, north of Spruce Fern Lane and extending to Lamb Boulevard for Lowman and Manch Elementary Schools forward as a recommendation to the Board of School Trustees for Clyde Cox, Craig, Lowman, Manch, and Woolley Elementary Schools.

Review of focus area E2 for the new Keller Elementary School and Adams, Cambeiro, Edwards, Goldfarb, Gragson, Herr, Iverson, M.L. King, Jr., Lunt, Mendoza, Moore, Mountain View, Rundle, Snyder, and Wengert Elementary Schools.

There was discussion of leaving Mountain View, Herr, and M.L. King, Jr. Elementary Schools off the recommendation.

Erin Cranor said if the 117 students are added to Cambeiro and Lunt Elementary School's current enrollment, she did not think it was enough to trigger them to a year-round calendar. Mrs. Cranor said moving the 117 students is the best way to address the over-crowding at Gragson Elementary School.

Becky Nielson said the administration at both Cambeiro and Lunt Elementary Schools are concerned about going to a year-round calendar because a new program that has been put in place is conducive to a 9-month calendar.

Erin Cranor said she would like the 32 students in the area south of Charleston Boulevard, east and southeast of the Parcel Boundary, north of the Las Vegas Wash and west of the Parcel Boundary to remain at Mendoza Elementary School.

A motion was made to take focus area E2, proposal 1 as amended to remove Mountain View, Herr, and M.L. King Jr. Elementary Schools; and to leave the 32 students in the area south of Charleston Boulevard, east and southeast of the Parcel Boundary, north of the Las Vegas Wash and west of the Parcel Boundary remain at Mendoza Elementary School forward as a recommendation to the Board of School Trustees for the new Keller Elementary School and adjust the boundaries of Cambeiro, Edwards, Goldfarb, Gragson, Iverson, Lunt, Mendoza, Moore, Rundle, Snyder, and Wengert Elementary Schools.

Becky Nielson called for a recess at 10:44 am. The meeting resumed at 10:54 am.

Review of focus area H1 for the new Sunrise Mountain High School and Chaparral, Desert Pines, Eldorado, Las Vegas, Mojave, and Rancho High Schools.

Erin Cranor said proposal 4 was the most favored at the public input meetings. Mrs. Cranor said she did not agree it was the best choice as the area bounded by Stewart Avenue, Lamb Boulevard, Charleston Boulevard, and Nellis Boulevard would be better served if they stayed at Las Vegas High School.

The commission reviewed proposal 3.

Sharon Dattoli said because of the demographics, there has been discussion about the possibility of Sunrise Mountain High School having a 400 seat magnet program.

Becky Nielson recognized Sheri Davies.

Sheri Davies, Assistant Superintendent, Northeast Region, said the new school should have enough students in order to offer a variety of programs to compete with the existing area high schools if the magnet program does not occur. Ms. Davies also said Bailey Middle School has had a decline in enrollment due to the change in the economy.

A motion was made to take focus area H1, proposal 3 as amended to leave the area bounded by the Sloan Channel, Lake Mead Boulevard, Hollywood Boulevard, and Owens Avenue at Eldorado High School; and to take the area bounded by Fremont Street, St. Louis, Wyoming Avenue, Lamb Boulevard, and Charleston Boulevard to Desert Pines High School; and to leave the area bounded by US-95, Bruce Street, Eastern Avenue, and Bonanza Road, at Rancho High School as a recommendation to the Board of School Trustees for the new Sunrise Mountain High School and Chaparral, Desert Pines, Eldorado, Las Vegas, Mojave, and Rancho High Schools.
